It is clear that the author, Mr. Tetro, along with Huffington Post editors, believe that vaccinations are mandatory in Ontario after reading the MOHLTC web page. Once again, the Ministry's failure to provide complete and accurate information on their website regarding the Immunization of School Pupils Act, has led to another media outlet spreading misinformation regarding the vaccination situation in Ontario to their readers.
